Guest Speaker: Dr. Sharon Carlson

Dr. Sharon Carlson is an archival and historical consultant who has worked for Michigan Women Forward, the City of Livonia, and the Meijer Heritage Center. She previously served as president of the Historical Society of Michigan and in 2020 retired as head of Western Michigan University's Archives and Regional History Collections after 35 years. She holds degrees in history and library science and is certified through the Academy of Certified Archivists. A resident of Kalamazoo, Dr. Carlson is currently the vice president of the Kalamazoo Ladies' Library Association. She is writing a book based on her dissertation research focusing on the role of women's organizations in the development of public libraries in Michigan.
