Since Ben Shuldiner began serving as Superintendent of the Lansing School District in 2022, graduation and attendance rates are up, marking progress towards two of the district's goals. Universal pre-k and Lansing Tech are new opportunities. However, some challenges persist, including low test scores, and his plans have included prioritizing teacher selection. The prime focus now is "teaching our curriculum to fidelity and getting our students to the appropriate state standards."



Benjamin Shuldiner has been Superintendent of the Lansing School District since 2022. Previously, he was a Dean's Fellow and the Distinguished Lecturer of Education Leadership at Hunter College, City University of New York. In 2016 and 2017, he was elected President of the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD). After receiving a grant from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in 2002, he was co-founder and principal of a charter school in Brooklyn.
